

2019 Summer Reading Projects for students entering Grade 3

After reading your 2 books, choose two of the following projects to do over the summer. Bring your completed project to school by September 13th.

Build a miniature stage set in a shoe box showing a scene from the book. On the back write an explanation of the scene.

Draw a comic strip for your favorite scene from the book.

Design an advertisement poster for your book. Include pictures that will interest your readers in purchasing the book. Be sure to include a paragraph that tell about the characters and one that gives plot details to interest readers without giving away the ending.

Write a letter/email to the author telling what you liked about the book.

Use a hanger and make a mobile about your book. Add details about the characters, setting, and plot.

Make a book jacket for your book. Remember to add a book summary on the inside flap.

Make up a test for your book. Include 5 true/false questions, 5 multiple choice questions, and two sentence responses. Make sure you add the answer key with the test.

Write a letter (10 sentences at least) to the main character in your book. You can ask questions, voice a complaint, protest a situation and give suggestions or advice to the character.

Please make sure that all work is the child's work. The family is encouraged to participate in the reading and discussion, but the work must be the student's.
